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General Grading Policies

- Grades are based upon the demonstration of proficiency on units associated within specific grade reporting criteria and are reflective of the categories used to determine AP Exam test scores.
- **Students are held to the Academic Integrity Policy for Mountain Range High School.**
- Wherever practical, students are given multiple opportunities to demonstrate their current level of understanding and mastery of standards.
- Students are only offered a multiple opportunity if their absence was justifiably excused. Teachers may deny a multiple opportunity if the student is unexcused or if a student has a single period excused absence without a parent signing the student out or a doctor's note.
- **Missing or incomplete assignments:** Superintendent Policies 6280 Homework and 6281 Make-Up Work will be followed for this course. They state that it is the student's responsibility to request and obtain missing work. When a student has an excused absence, the student has the same number of days they were absent plus one day to make up assignments. Students who are unexcused may not be able to receive feedback from practice prior to required assessments.

Attendance Notification & Auto Caller
