<b>Course Name</b>	<b>Introduction to Business/Principles of Marketing A</b>
<b>Course Description</b>	Thinking about a career in marketing, management, sales, or merchandising? Introduction to Business/Principles of Marketing A prepares students entering occupations that require skills in sales, buying, retailing, finance and investments. Students will learn job application and interview techniques, basic sales skills, marketing math, economics, advertising, promotion, pricing and marketing strategies. Students will learn marketing and business economics by running their own businesses with the assistance of computer simulations.
